### Play & Leisure

- Go outdoors for a family and friends get together. There are lots of scenic picnic areas with **BBQ facilities**, fenced playgrounds for the kids, and places for your dogs to run around off-leash.
- Have some quiet time along the **River Torrens** (B4) with just your book, headphones or iPod Free Wi-Fi access available in most parks. Or head to the **Himatj Gardens** (29/F7), a place with grand landscapes and exquisite natural beauty or the **Pioneer Women's Memorial Garden** (30/D4), a tranquil place with a rich history.

### History & Heritage

- Discover traces of the state's industrial heritage and visit the **Valley House Square** (32/C3) and find out more about the man who planned Adelaide.
- Take a self-guided 'Colonel Light tour' – visit **Light's Vision** (32/C3 and Light Square) (33/C5) and find out more about the man who planned Adelaide.
- Follow the River Torrens down to the **Torrens Weir** (34/B4). This hefty concrete sluice gate is a State Heritage Place with impressive river views or walk over some of the impressive bridges along the Torrens, such as the **Albert Bridge** (E3), the **Adelaide Bridge** (D4), and the **Old Railway Bridge** (B3).

- Tour the **West Terrace Cemetery** (38/B7) – the site is as old as European settlement and the graves have unique stories and provide a glimpse into South Australian history.
- Tour the nearby **Old Adelaide Gaol** (35/B4), one of the oldest remaining colonial public buildings in the city, the state's military history at the Torrens Parade Ground and various **war memorials** in the city (State War Memorial – D5, Cross of Sacrifice – D4, Pioneer Women's Memorial Garden – 30/D4).
- Take a wander through the bushland setting of **Nano Womma** (Park 6/D2) in the northern Park Lands and find **horses** (31/E1) and great views to the Adelaide Hills, a playground, community oval and a rural landscape remote from the City.

- Head over to **Wirranendi** (Park 23/B6) and follow the Wirranendi Trail, which winds from sculpture to sculpture in the western Park Lands. Or take a ride on **Popeye** (D4) or the paddle boats and see the city from another perspective.

- Take advantage of some of the great sporting facilities in the Park Lands including the **Adelaide Aquatic Centre** (42/C1), the **North Adelaide Golf Course** (North Course – 43/B2, South Course – 44/B3) and **Adelaide Bowling Club** (45/F5). Or join a sporting team for regular sports such as cricket, tennis, touch football, soccer, hockey, archery and croquet.

- With European settlement came the introduction of exotic species from around the world, contrasting with the many native plantings throughout the Park Lands – visit the **Botanic Gardens** (46/E4) which provide a rich and varied landscape.

- Wander along **North Terrace** (50/D5) or through **Victoria Square/Tarndanyangga** (51/D6) and admire statues of historic figures ranging from His Majesty King Edward VII to explorers John McDouall Stuart and Captain Charles Sturt.

### Culture & Arts

- Throughout spring, summer and autumn, the city plays host to a variety of festivals that bring energy, food, music and buzzing crowds to the Park Lands, such as the Adelaide Festival, the Fringe and the Garden of Unearthly Delights.
- Visit the **Cross of Sacrifice** (D4) and other sculptures in the **Pennington Gardens** (49/D3) precinct near St Peter's Cathedral and in nearby Peace Park. You can see the Memorial to Forgotten Australians by artist Craig Andre.

- Wander along **North Terrace** (50/D5) or through **Victoria Square/Tarndanyangga** (51/D6) and admire statues of historic figures ranging from His Majesty King Edward VII to explorers John McDouall Stuart and Captain Charles Sturt.
- From impressive monuments to understated sculptures, the contemporary artworks in the Park Lands make a giant outdoor gallery to explore – such as the lie of the Land installation by artists Alecks Danko and Jude Walton on **Sir Donald Bradman Drive** (B6).
